A menace to society

- 56 year old man, living in Websters Land (just off High Street, in central Edinburgh)
- 186 convictions for breach of the peace
- A man deemed by social services so aggressive he was risk assessed as being too dangerous for two people to work with
- About to be evicted for non- payment of rent and end up on street (having made himself deliberately homeless, according to the legislation)



And now, 12 years down the line





Not just older people

350

service users annually 60% reduction in re-offending in Follow Me service

100% reduction in social isolation across all services

90% improvement in mental health across all services

50% reduction in alcohol abuse in CARDS

• Gerry's story depression, anxiety and inability to cope following his wife's death 30 years ago two failed tenancies; countless evictions from temp accomm units, often due to alcohol consumption/curfew breaches rough sleeping on and off for 30 years unable to continue rough sleeping aged 68; accepted Thorntree Street as had "heard it was an OK place"
