Integration is one of the most pressing contemporary concerns for public services. Much work has been carried out on the structural dimensions of integration. However, other challenges remain. The purpose of this series is to explore and learn from experience around four broad themes:

- what is known about the cultural dimensions of integration across professional, organisational and sectoral boundaries and with service users?
- How can digital/smart technology best support integration?
- How might academics work best with practice agencies to support change and innovation?
