# Technologies and inter-professional working

November 29 2018: Collins Building, Richmond St., University of Strathclyde

## What will this event aim to do?

This is the third session in a series on inter-professional working. The emphasis has been on working between health and social care, although not exclusively. The first event examined the research evidence on inter-professional working to date, as well as questions around professional identity. The second explored the co-production of design and delivery across disciplines. Neither session is a prerequisite for this third event, which looks at technologies and inter-professional working. This will cover some broad issues. It will look at the way in which there is often a gap between technology design, assumptions about its usefulness and the experiences of end users – in essence the complexities of the social dimension of technologies. The session will also explore the potential for using technologies across health and social care settings, how these different settings are being factored into design and the problems likely to arise therein. A final presentation will pull together some of the points from the events so far, asking why, health and social care are integrating (when integration is difficult to achieve) and how the language of co-production (which underpins personalisation and self-directed support) is open to different understandings across inter-professional settings.

There will be ample opportunity for discussion between sessions.

## Who might want to attend?

This is a knowledge exchange event, so anyone from local government, health or other professions where technologies are in use across settings would be welcome, in addition to researchers from universities.
